Septic Variance:

Neeley - Parcel ID# 200.14-1-23 Property Location: 17 Cotton Court

Attached are four sets of the Onsite Wastewater Treatment System (OWTS) design drawings prepared by Studio A to replace the old septic system at the above referenced parcel with a 1,000 gallon precast septic tank and precast concrete pump station. Disposal of treated water will be to four rows of 55' advanced enviro-septic pipe as manufactured by Presby Environmental, Inc. Acting as Town Engineer, I have reviewed and signed off on this proposal.

The following variances are sought to replace a septic system. The four rows of 55 feet long advanced enviro-septic pipe as manufactured by Presby Environmental, Inc. are located within 41 feet of a federal wetland, the pump station is located within 56 feet of a federal wetland and the septic tank is located within 65 feet of the federal wetland. The house itself is located within 71 feet of the federal wetland.
